SPRING TUNE UP

Grass and Yards:

Curbside yard waste pickup is to be provided by RMS on the SAME day as regular garbage collection. Please use recyclable paper bags. Containers may be rented directly through RMS (788-5096) for an annual fee of \$32.00.

Recycling:

RMS will be collecting boxboard products (cereal, crackers, tissue boxes and the like) as part of the bi-weekly recycling pick-up, however the plastic insert (bag) must be removed and the box is to be flattened and placed in a paper bag. Cardboard will also be collected as part of the recycling pick-up, provided it is broken down or cut to fit in a brown paper bag. Discarded mail & magazines are recyclable also but the City recommends any mail with personal information be shredded.

For those of you that want a larger recyclable container, contact RMS or purchase one from Wal-mart or other store. RMS will pick up additional containers of recycling placed out for collection that are the same size or smaller than the one provided.

Garbage:

Trash bags are available at City Hall. The trash collector will not pick up any bags other than the City bags. Ten bags can be purchased for \$5.00.

Heavy Items:

Tags are available at City Hall. Residents are allowed two free heavy item pick ups (this does not include appliances) per year. Additional tags may be purchased for \$10 and all tags can be used for individual items or for a load of items. The items need to be placed on the terrace with your garbage and arrangements must be made with the City. RMS will pick up what they can and the City will pick up any additional items.

2007 PROJECTS:

Greenwich Road

The City will be replacing the water main on Greenwich Road beginning at Glenside Boulevard and ending at Colonial Road. As part of this project, we will repair the storm sewer and repave the road in the same section.

Roosevelt Road

The City will be installing a new water main on Roosevelt Road beginning at the parking lot entrance to the tennis courts and ending at Greenwich Road. This project will improve fire flows and water quality in the area.

Henry Street

Just a reminder, the City of Norton Shores will be reconstructing Henry Street from Summit Avenue to Seminole Road this summer. The project will accommodate traffic to businesses in the construction area.

2007 RP CITIZENS SURVEY

The City has partnered with Grand Valley State University to conduct a survey of our residents. The survey asks several questions about our infrastructure (streets, water/sewer, and storm drainage) and City services. GVSU plans on distributing the survey during the month of March so be on the lookout for it.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLE ORDINANCE

The Recreational Vehicle Ordinance will be enforced throughout the City. Key points of the ordinance are:

- Any RV shall be parked or stored in an enclosed building or in a driveway no closer than five feet from any public sidewalk; in the rear yard; or stored no closer than three feet from any window.
- Other than in an enclosed building, no person shall park or store more than one recreational vehicle upon any lot.
- RV's may be parked within any yard for cleaning, loading, or unloading purposes for not more than 72 hours within a seven day period.
